



### RITUAL

Many of our comrades, particularly Chefs de Gare, have found themselves on the "horse-laugh" side of a Promenade due to their mangling of the few French words they're required to use, or to their lapses in adherence to correct ritual procedure. Hopefully, all Chefs de Gare have not forgotten to appoint a Locale Ritual Directeur to assist the Chef in these matters, as well as to submit an annual consolidated RITUAL report from the Locale to the Grand. In the absence of a Locale Ritual Directeur, it falls on the shoulders of the Correspondant to submit this vital annual report. Copies are required to be sent to both the Grand Directeur of Ritual and the Grand Correspondant to be received no later than July 1, 2009. If your locale does not have blank copies of the report, I will gladly provide them.

You need to get them now, however, which will allow accurate tabulation of all ritual items as they occur throughout the 40 & 8 year.

Once reports are received from the locales, they are assembled by the Grand Directeur of Ritual to determine awards which will be awarded by both the Grand and National. I

will gladly visit any locale within our Grand to observe your promenades, memorial services, wrecks, etc. that involve adherence to a ritual format.

I will then, if requested, provide feedback as to how you're doing; if improvements may be needed; if your rituals are worthy of awards recognition. I may also simply drop in at a few promenades for visitations. But on those occasions, it would not be for the purpose of judging (in any way), or to critique any ritual.

Copies of our *Ritual & Manual of Ceremonies* in both regular size and print, and jumbo size and print, are available at National Emblem Sales. Not only are all rituals and ceremonies completely presented in these books, but they also provide a phonetic pronunciation dictionary of French near the end of the book.

If you do not have one of these, I suggest you order them promptly. I suggest that all Chefs de Gare avail themselves of the French dictionary particularly.

Also available at National is the 40 & 8 *Memorial Service Manual* containing a complete guide to memorial services. Please ensure your locale has a copy of this valuable manual also.

Again let me remind you that your locale is eligible for several awards provided they pay close attention to our rituals and also provided they submit their annual Ritual Consolidated Report on time.

I truly enjoy, respect, and select as friends my comrades in the 40 & 8. To that end, I will fit in as many visitations as I possibly can during this year.


