ELIGIBILITY

Section 1. WHO MAY BECOME MEMBERS: No persons other than honorably discharged U.S. military personnel and active duty U.S. military may become members of La Societe des Quarante Hommes et Huit Chaevaux. No Grande Voiture or Voiture Locale may prescribe or establish any eligibility qualifications for membership in La Societe which are in conflict with the Constitution of Voiture Nationale.

This being said please feel free to start taking in those members which are not members of the Legion. Please do not forget the Legion members they are still a vital part of La Societe and will always be a part of our history and future. Also remember we now have to check DD214's. It would be wise to get a copy of everyone's and keep them in a safe place. The IRS is looking real hard at all non-profit organizations. If we start doing this it could save all of us problems in the years to come. Thank you for all the work you do for La Societe.

THE GREATEST GENERATION Soldier left memory of love,

In the midst of the horrors of war, Army Pvt. Harold Galley found reason to be thankful.

"I've learned many things in this war. It never came to my mind before that people could endure so much and still live and be thankful just to be alive and thank God for being spared to live another day. I do realize it now."

Galley wrote those words to his daughter, Carolyn, during World War II.

Galley worked for the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. in Omaha

when he was drafted in March 1944. He went through basic training in Camp Fannin, Texas, and was sent overseas in September. Just a few months later, Carolyn, then 9, and her mother, Irene, would receive the terriblenews.

"In late 1944, there were so many American soldiers being killed in action that there were no military personnel to visit the family and give them the news," Carolyn remembers. "A telegram was sent and delivered to the home. I remember that day very well. My mother was at

work and I was outside playing when the dreaded telegram arrived."

Carolyn Givan, now living in Greeley, Colo., has many mementos of her father: a letter written to her and her mother by the secretary of state, a letter from President Franklin Roosevelt, her father's Purple Heart - and a touching, heartfelt letter he wrote her from Belgium:

My Dearest Daughter Carolyn:

It has been a few days since I have written to either you or your mother. At times writing is out of the question.

I hope the both of you will understand that if it were possible I would write you every hour of the day.

For the first time in several days I am at least dry again and the sun has come out of hiding. It seems to rain more here than anything else. I don't mind it in the least, I'm getting used toitnow

In the country that I am in, the people really know what war is. Their homes have been bombed and shelled until there just isn't much left to them. The windows are broken out See Soldier: Page 2

Continued from Page 1 and even sides of the houses are gone too, but they live in them just the same. Many of the children have very few clothes, let alone enough to eat. Wouldn't it seem very funny to you to have to beg soldiers of another land in order to get a little bit of sugar or candy or cookies or gum that you might have any at all. You see their stores don't have it to sell. there just isn't any to be had here. And how would you like to wear wooden shoes like the little Dutch children do, or even worse yet wear heavy high-top shoes that in many cases don't fit with wooden soles on them. I also saw little children that are crippled because they get hurt in the awful war.

I went to their church for services, this church had been bombed or shelled and was caved in, the windows broken and it was cold but they went anyway. I saw them pray and sing and give their money and be thankful that they could do so without being bombed or shelled while they were at church.

Yes, Carolyn, I've learned many things in this war. It never came to my mind before that people could endure so much and

> milk a cow. I guess he got some to drink, as least I hope he did, he tried hard enough to get some. The fellows are always trying to build a fire to make coffee or warm up some food. Generally, as soon as the fire gets going good the train starts to go again. The fellows will play with handcars that are along the tracks, push them around or play with some farmer's dog that is close by.

still live and be thankful just to be alive and thank God for being spared to live another day. I do realize it now. And I only hope that another war does not come again. I realize that you are young and it is hard for you to understand the evils of war and I also suppose you have many times wondered why your daddy had to go to war. At times I did too. It is only natural that to save the best country on earth, the best people. I have discovered that we are the best, the strong-est, the bravest, the most ingenuous, the brightest people in the world today. I know we have more of everything and better things than any other people in the world today. The way we live and think and do was not given to us, you or I but it was paid for by our forefathers; by fighting, bloodshed, prayer and the will to live as free people. And to achieve, and don't you ever let anyone tell you different. Your daddy is fighting to cause the rest of the world to be free and live like we do.

I have been writing at this letter now for a couple of weeks or more and feel that I should end it soon, but before I do I imagine you would like to hear about how

we travel around over here. One way, of course, is in trucks, but generally not very far at a time. Mostly, it has been in boxcars, such as your grandpa sends cattle or sheep to market in. On the outside of the car is a sign painted worded like this "40 Hommes or 8 Chevauzx" which mean 40 men or 8 horses in one box car.

Well, that's how we ride men in a car plus our packs and rifles, to say the least, it is very crowded in the daytime, but at night it is even worse trying to sleep. Everyone tries to lay down on the floor. Some, of course, can't but if you do lay down, you soon wake up because of being cramped or someone has his foot in your face. You can imagine the groans and grunts all night long. Just as everyone is all settled again, someone decides that he must go to the toilet, so he gets up and starts to walk over the other. My, how everyone howls when you step on someone by mistake. At least you get to the door that is the toilet. If the train is stopped you can go to the toilet outside on the ground during the daytime. Just as soon as the train stops, the fellows climb out and run around the train to see what they can see. One day a couple of fellows ran over into a pasture and tried to


