SPRING GRAND CHEMINOT, JUNE 27, 2015 TRUMAN HOTEL, JEFFERSON CITY, Missouri

With a rap of the gavel, Grand Chef de Gare Leon Hill, opened the Grand Cheminot sharply at 1:00 PM with a salute to the Flag, the Pledge of Allegiance, and a much needed prayer by Grand Aumonier John Kopp.

Roll call of officers showed more absent than excused and the rest were paying their fines. Roll call of Grand Chefs de Gare Passe showed twelve answered. Roll call of Grand Cheminots showed there was a quorum. Voyageurs don't know how to answer roll call and many paid fines for it. Absent were Voitures 3, 333, 447, 520, 966, 1395, and 1402.

Grand Avocat Rich Heigert said we will follow the same Rules of Procedure as last time.

Notion offered by Kevin Johnson, seconded by Art Wilson, that the Spring Grand Cheminot minutes are accepted as printed and sent out...passed.

Grand Correspondant Terry Lanning said he needed the Voitures to send in their Officers and Directeurs. There a handout of information on buying an ad in the 2016 Promenade Nationale program and a handout that explained what the 40/8 is.

Grand Commissaire Intendant, Chip Berkley, stated the finance report was passed out and discussed. It will be approved after the audit report.

Grand Chef Hill called on the Chef de Train Dave Bexten to report on the membership. Dave said we are at 90% of quota. We need 108 members to be 100%. Sous Chef de Train Janice Hartley reported she visited 4 of her assigned 5 Voiture Locals and commended Voiture 1541 for achieving over 100%. Sous Chef de Train Franklin Angelo reported his area Voitures are at 89% and 18 short. Sous Chef de Train David Voyles stated Voiture 130 is at 94% and he will try to visit Voiture 333.

Some of the highlights of the Grand Cheminot reports are: Voiture 38 has their locomotive up and running. Loco attended two school parades. Had a memorial service at their Chateau on May 18th. Three voyageurs attended the 11/12 District memorial Day Service at Soldiers Memorial.; Voiture 448 had a BBQ on May 16, 2015 at Cabela's, are meeting at the Elks Lodge in Ballwin on the fourth Tuesday at 7:30pm, xmas and Easter party at Marygrove, and will have a fundraiser Fish Fry at Post 400 on October 9, 2015 in Fenton, and will have their Installation on July 25, 2015 at Post 397; Voiture 460 has 26 nurses at \$13,000, donated \$2,396 on Americanism, supported Child Welfare for \$7,750, supported several youth sport teams for \$2,068, sponsored 3 dinners for \$312, and membership is at 90%; Voiture 760 has 2 nurses in training, sponsored a xmas party for $2^{\rm nd}$ graders; Voiture 1292 membership at 97%, has 4 nurses in training, Flag Day program, wrecked 2 PG's; Voiture 1321 has its cooker out in Herculaneum, has 4 nurses in training; Voiture 1379 ChickNick will be August 15, 2015, and will have a dance on September 26, 2015 at Liberty; Voiture 1541 Car Show will be August, 15 2015, Installation on August 15, 2015 at Post 312, membership at 111%.

Grand Directeur Historian Allen Schultz awarded $1^{\rm st}$ place to Voiture 1541

Grand Avocat Richard Heigert said he has received 4 revised constitutions. All Voitures need to check theirs and see if they need to be updated.

Grand Directeur Child Welfare Calvin Bumgarner reported he received 9 reports and $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 1321, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 460, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 1292.

Grand Directeur Voiture Activities George Ridley reported he received 6 reports but he created a report for everyone. $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 448, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 333, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 1292.

Grand Directeur Nurses Training Jim Hartley could not be here so Janice Hartley gave his report. $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 3, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 460, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 1292.

Grand Directeur Aumonier John Kopp said to let him know if a Grand Officer is sick or passes away so he can send them a card. He has sent out 2 get well cards. Each Voiture should send him a list of their deceased for the Memorial Service.

Grand Organizer Robert Phillips said there was a possibility of a new Voiture.

Grand Publiciste Chris Bryson could not be here so AJ Noonan gave his report. $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 333, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 448, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 760.

Grand Directeur Americanism Bob Emery reported he received 12 reports and $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 1321, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 460, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 38.

Grand Directeur Box Car Ed Schmidt reported he has 2016 pins and cards. The new coins will be out at Promenade Nationale. $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 1379, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 448, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 760.

Grand Directeur Carville Star Mike Scruby reported he received 10 reports and $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 448, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 1541, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 460.

Grand Directeur Ritual Benjamin Sargent could not be here so Ralph Turner read Ben's report. He received 8 reports. We had a good turnout for the Spring Wreck and all went well. Some of the Voitures reported funerals attended but no miles devoted to ritual. Overall the reports showed dollars spent of \$1,048, hours 7323 and miles $21,050.1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 1321, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 760, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 460.

Sous Grand Directeur Special Awards Hero of the Year Mike Brueckmann reported he sent notices to all Voitures but did not receive any nominations.

Grand VAVS Chairman Don Newman reported he received 6 reports and $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 460, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 1541, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 1292. He put in for an award to get 10 robes for ladies at VA Hospital and won \$300 from Voiture Nationale.

Grand Directeur Youth Sports A.J. Noonan reported he received 10 reports and $1^{\rm st}$ place went to Voiture 460, $2^{\rm nd}$ place to Voiture 1321, and $3^{\rm rd}$ place to Voiture 1379.

Grand Sous Correspondant, Grant Willis said the next newsletter will go out at the end of July.

Time and Place Committee Chairman Art Wilson said the committee has been looking for other places and it has not been easy. Art offered a notion to take the notion off of the table $2^{\rm nd}$ by Grant and passed. Art had a meeting with the Truman Hotel and they said right now they are not taking any reservation for 2016. He will know July 1, 2015 if that changes. Larry is going to check on the Doubletree at Jefferson City, this is the same owner. Rich Heigert offered a notion to have the Time and Place Committee be authorized to pick the best place possible, seconded by Kevin Johnson and passed.

Distinguished Voyageur Award Committee Chairman Grant Willis said he did not receive any nominations and there a number of worthy Voyageurs out there.

VA Launches Campaign to Increase Veterans' Economic Potential

DALLAS — Secretary of Veterans Affairs Robert A. McDonald, with leaders from national and local Veterans service organizations corporate employers and government agencies, announced the launch of the Veterans Economic Communities Initiative, an effort focused in a total of 50 U.S. cities to promote economic success for Veterans.

The initiative is part of MyVA, which is dedicated to making Veterans the center of all we do

"The best way to get things done for Veterans is to involve partners from both the public and private sectors - national to local," said McDonald. "If history has shown us anything, it's that all you have to do is give Veterans an opportunity and they will go beyond anything you could ever envision. Community leaders understand the purpose of MyVA and will find innovative ways to support it."

The goal of the VECI is to increase education and employment opportunities for America's Veterans by bringing together local and national employers to coordinate services for Veterans, Servicemembers and military families.

With the sacred commitment of making customer service for Veterans the focal point, VA will look to communities around the country to help make the VA the best federal agency.

"MyVA will work State by state, community by community, person by person," said McDonald. "We want to expand our reach and collaboration in communities where Veterans live.

The Veterans Economic Communities Initiative launch event was hosted in Dallas. Secretary McDonald and Dallas Mayor Mike Rawlings provided remarks, during the event. Campaign partners also participated in panel discussions on public-private partnerships

Representatives from major corporations such as Hilton and TriWest joined Secretary McDonald in pledging their commitment to furthering Veteran economic opportunities

The Veterans Economic Communities Initiative includes a VA Economic Liaison in each community who will expand and encourage collaboration among private and public organizations that offer resources related to education, training and employment. Through strategic partnerships, and by offering Veterans innovative forms of learning and employment opportunities, these communities will help Veterans gain competitive career skills and knowledge in locally in-demand fields.

Campaign partners include the departments of Defense and Labor, the Small Business Administration and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, in addition to regional and national nonprofits, businesses and educators. The first 25 communities were chosen based on local Veteran unemployment rates, Veteran population and the projected increase in Veteran population.


